

Capps Lecture and Book Signing with Jesmyn Ward and Kiese Laymon

The 2018 Capps Lecture will feature MacArthur Genius and two-time National Book Award winner Jesmyn Ward. Ward has been hailed as a standout writer of her generation, with a "fearless and toughly lyrical" voice in novels, memoir, and nonfiction. In 2017, she became the first woman and the first person of color to win two National Book Awards for Fiction - joining the ranks of William Faulkner, Saul Bellow, John Cheever, Philip Roth, and John Updike. Also featured is Kiese Laymon, author of the groundbreaking essay collection, How to Slowly Kill Yourself and Others in America, and novels, Heavy and Long Division, which has been called "an ambitious mix of contemporary southern gothic with Murakamiesque magical realism" by literary review magazine Booklist. Laymon's work confronts issues of race, gender, family, place, and has earned him comparisons to both Mark Twain and Ta-Nehisi Coates.
